

About brain injury

An **acquired brain injury** is an injury to the brain, which is not hereditary, congenital, degenerative, or induced by birth trauma. An acquired brain injury is an injury to the brain that has occurred after birth. Causes of ABI include:

stroke (hemorrhage, blood clot) lack of oxygen (i.e., drowning, choking, hypoxic/anoxic injury)

tumor infectious disease that affect the brain (i.e., meningitis, encephalitis)

seizure toxic exposure/poisoning (i.e., carbon monoxide, lead exposure)

electric shock metabolic disorders

drug overdose

A **traumatic brain injury** (TBI) is defined as an alteration in brain function, or other evidence fo brain pathology, caused by an external force. Causes of a TBI include:

assaults, child/domestic abuse falls

motor vehicle accidents gunshot wounds

sports injuries Shaken Baby Syndrome

workplace injuries military action

Whatever the cause, a brain injury has a life-altering impact. Understanding the signs and where to seek help is important. Raising awareness and funds to provide much needed services to neighbors in our community is critical.



Our programs

ADAPT Clubhouse Gives members the opportunity to practice and develop important life skills in a supportive, work-ordered environment.

Adult Case Management Individuals are served through a community-based case management system that supports person-centered planning and a survivor-directed approach.

ComPASS Our team of occupational therapists works with clients to build life skills through different therapy methods including assistive technology and cognitive rehabilitation. The goal is for clients to lead fulfilling lives and to be able to participate in activities that are important to them.

Counseling Services Short-term, goal directed counseling services for clients and their caregivers.

Fredericksburg Community Services A day program that serves clients in groups and individually with the goal of increasing their integration into the community.

Pediatric Case Management Comprehensive services that are family centered and allow children with brain injuries to maximize their capabilities and achieve personal success at school and in their community.

Veterans Integration Program (VIP) Specialized programs and services intended to work alongside other veteran services that may already be in place.


Vocational Programs Provides assistance with setting suitable volunteer and employment goals, finding and keeping a paid volunteer job, and thriving at work using the long-standing supported employment model.

Volunteering Individualized services that facilitate success in accomplishing goals and finding productive activities in the community including Speaker's Bureau, PALS, and Person-Centered Volunteering.


